## Father Bill's Weekly Message

#### **TERRORISM**

Two weeks ago, the Palestinian organization *Hamas*, launched a terrorist attack on Israel. I call it terrorism because the attack was launched on civilians. Whenever a military force targets civilians, they are committing terrorism, not fighting a war.

The Catholic Church has developed a doctrine of morality concerning the waging of war called "The Just War Doctrine." The explanation of the morality of armed conflict can be found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church under the discussion of the Fifth Commandment. "You shall not kill."

However, we are talking about terrorism, not war. There is no moral way to practice terrorism. The point is to create fear. There is no military objective, only a political one. The means used to achieve that political objective are immoral.

In Paragraph 2312 of the Catechism we read, "The Church and human reason both assert the permanent validity of the moral law during armed conflict. "The mere fact that war has regrettably broken out does not mean that everything becomes licit between the warring parties.""

In Paragraph 2297 we read, "Kidnapping and hostage taking bring on a reign of terror; by means of threats they subject their victims to intolerable pressures. They are morally wrong. Terrorism threatens, wounds, and kills indiscriminately is gravely against justice and charity. Torture which uses physical or moral violence to extract confessions, punish the guilty, frighten opponents, or satisfy hatred is contrary to respect for the person and human dignity."

One of the dictates of the Just War doctrine is "non-combatant immunity." Civilian populations cannot be targeted. Since terrorism targets civilian populations, it can never be morally justified. It is always morally wrong.


