Father Bill's Weekly Message

THANKSGIVING

The Fourth Thursday in November is
Thanksgiving Day in the United States. There were
days of Thanksgiving decreed by the President
and Congress at various times in our history.
Maybe this is because giving thanks builds
morale. It makes us look at the good instead of the
bad. The current tradition of observing
Thanksgiving on the fourth Thursday of November
began in 1941.

When we give thanks, we acknowledge that we received something good that we didn't deserve. If we receive something bad that we didn't deserve, we are more likely to be defensive than grateful. If we believe we deserve the good we experience, there is no reason to be grateful.

Thanksgiving is the opposite of pride. In pride, we put ourselves at the center of our universe. In thanksgiving, we put God at the center. The more we put ourselves at the center of our concerns, the less grateful we become.

The Greek word for thanksgiving is eucharistein. What we in the Church call our worship means, "to give thanks." In the Mass we acknowledge that we received something good that we didn't deserve- mercy. As St. Paul writes, "God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us." (Romans 5, 8) God showers His mercy on us because we need it, not because we deserve it.

Usually, we give thanks for events in the past or the present. Christians are different because we give thanks for the future as well. We thank God for salvation, which is in process and won't be completed until the end of time. It takes faith in God to be grateful for the future.

There is a saying, "Seeing is believing." For the Christian, believing is seeing and when we believe it, we will see it. Faith in God leads to thanksgiving and when we believe in God's love, we will recognize it in our world in the past, the present, and the future.


Council meetings are open to all parishioners, and are typically on the third Wed. of the month after Mass.


