Father Bill's Weekly Message

ADVENT

Next Sunday begins the liturgical season of Advent. It is the penitential season that prepares us to celebrate the birth of Christ at Christmas. Advent lasts for four Sundays, plus any weekdays that occur before sunset on December 24th. This year, because Christmas falls on a Monday, there are only 22 days of Advent.

The word "Advent" means, "coming". There are two comings of Christ that we contemplate during Advent.

From the beginning of Advent through December 16th we contemplate the "Second Coming" of Christ at the end of time. We believe Christ will return to establish the kingdom of God in its fullness. The sin, suffering, and injustice of this world will be overcome. Those who have remained faithful to God will be vindicated. The question for us is, "Who will we follow? Is Jesus Christ our savior? Or do we believe someone else has the right path to follow?"

The second part of Advent, from December 17th until sunset on the 24th, focuses on the events leading up to the birth of Christ. Jesus Christ came in the flesh in the Incarnation. He is fully human and fully divine. As the Letter to the Hebrews says, "He had to become like his brothers in every way, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest before God to expiate the sins of the people." (2, 17) Jesus Christ understands what it is to be human. He can be trusted to be compassionate toward us.

This time of the year we are usually busy preparing to celebrate Christmas with family and friends. Now is also the time to prepare ourselves spiritually to celebrate the birth of Christ. Through prayer and penance, we can prepare ourselves so that Christmas day will find us experiencing hope, peace, joy, and love: the four fruits of Advent.

May Christmas find us ready to welcome Christ with minds and hearts renewed.




