Father Bill's Weekly Message

HOPE

There are four Sundays of Advent. They are represented by the four candles on the Advent wreath. Each candle represents a theme for the week of Advent. They are (in order) Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that, as Christians, "we always have a future." (<u>Spe</u> <u>Salvi</u>) That is what it means to have hope: to believe there is always a future. But, more, to believe the future belongs to God. God is eternal. God has no beginning or end. As human beings, we have a beginning, but we will have no end.

As human beings, we can sometimes be nostalgic. We can long for the past, though usually the past we long for is imagined and never existed. As Christians, we can never be nostalgic. We must yearn for the future. According to the scriptures, the future we long for will be one where, "God may be all in all." (1Corinthians 15, 28) In the future, God will be everything in everyone. The less sin there is in the world, the closer we are to that future.

Advent is a penitential season. That is why it is a season of hope. The less we sin, the more hope we have. By clearing away our sins and increasing our virtues, we can have hope for a future with God. There is always hope that we can be better people; that we can be more like Jesus Christ in His longing to do the Father's will.

The first half of Advent focuses on the return of Jesus Christ and the end of the world as we know it. Whether that is Good News or bad news depends on us. Advent is an opportunity God gives us to prepare for the future with God by clearing away the wreckage of the past.

Tuesday, December 12th is the Solemnity of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It is an important day in the Latino world. On the day we will have two masses in our parish. There will be Mass at 9:00 a.m. in English and 7:00 p.m. in Spanish. Celebrations Sunday, December 10, 2023 4:00-6:00 pm





CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE



Because December 25th falls on a Monday this year, there is an unusual situation for attending Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas).

Because both are Holy Days of Obligation, it is necessary to attend Mass *twice* that weekend.

For the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the Faithful can go to any Mass between 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, December 23rd and 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, December 24th.

For Christmas, the Faithful can attend *any* Mass between 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 24th and 11:59 p.m. on Monday, December 25th.

At Our Lady of the Lake, you can fulfill your obligation in the following ways:

Fourth Sunday of Advent:

Saturday, December 23rd at 5:00 pm.

Sunday, December 24th at 8:30 or 11:15 a.m. *or* 4:30 or 8:30 p.m.

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas):

Sunday, December 24th at 4:30 or 8:30 p.m.

Monday, December 25th at 9:00 a.m.

If you are travelling, check with the local diocese as far as what they require to fulfill your obligation. It may be different than the Diocese of Birmingham.

Sorry, you cannot fulfill two obligations at one Mass. You are obligated to attend Mass twice. I promise Masses for the Fourth Sunday of Advent will last less than one hour.
