Father Bill's Weekly Message

PEACE

The theme of the second week (candle) of Advent is Peace. It is a much-talked-about topic now with wars going on in Ukraine, Israel, Gaza and many other places in the world. But peace is more than the absence of conflict. Peace is the fruit of justice.

In the Old Testament, the Hebrew word for peace is, "shalom". It refers to our relationship with God. When our lives are the way God wants them to be, we are experiencing peace. Jesus Christ came to bring us peace by reconciling us to the Father. Then we will be "justified", in right relationship with God. The result of being in right relationship with God is "shalom".

In our relationships with others, peace is the result of a just ordering of relationships. If there is injustice, either real or perceived, there is no peace. Even if there is no war, injustice will lead to conflict, which sometimes leads to war. Pope St. Paul VI wrote, "If you want peace, work for justice."

There are stories of Christians at war with each other calling a truce at Christmas. However, when Christmas was over, they went back to fighting. There is respect and disrespect for Jesus Christ involved in these actions. Everyone has the right to defend themselves. Perhaps addressing injustices is a more peaceful way to resolve conflicts.

One of the titles for Jesus Christ is "Prince of Peace". If we want peace both with God and with others, Jesus Christ is the one who can lead us to that goal. He came to earth to reconcile us to the Father by His passion and death. He left us an example of how to relate to God and others. His way is the way of peace.

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Tuesday, December 12th is the Solemnity of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It is an important day in the Latino world. On that day we will have two masses in our parish. There will be Mass at 9:00 a.m. in English and 7:00 p.m. in Spanish. Following the 7:00 Mass, there will be a procession of a statue of Our Lady from the church to the parish hall, followed by a fiesta. All are invited.





CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE



Because December 25th falls on a Monday this year, there is an unusual situation for attending Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas).

Because both are Holy Days of Obligation, it is necessary to attend Mass *twice* that weekend.

For the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the Faithful can go to any Mass between 4:00 p.m. on Saturday,
December 23rd and 11:59 p.m. on Sunday,
December 24th.

For Christmas, the Faithful can attend *any* Mass between 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 24th and 11:59 p.m. on Monday, December 25th.

At Our Lady of the Lake, you can fulfill your obligation in the following ways:

Fourth Sunday of Advent:

Saturday, December 23rd at 5:00 pm.

Sunday, December 24^{th} at 8:30 or 11:15 a.m. $\it or$ 4:30 or 8:30 p.m.

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas):

Sunday, December 24th at 4:30 or 8:30 p.m.

Monday, December 25th at 9:00 a.m.

If you are travelling, check with the local diocese as far as what they require to fulfill your obligation. It may be different than the Diocese of Birmingham.

Sorry, you cannot fulfill two obligations at one

Mass. You are obligated to attend Mass twice. I promise Masses for the Fourth Sunday of Advent will last less than one hour.
