Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

As we are about to begin a new year, it might be helpful to review the basic precepts of the Catholic Church. These are minimum requirements for all members of the Church.

What does the Church mean by precepts?

"Positive laws made by Church authorities to guarantee for the faithful the indispensable **minimum in prayer and moral effort**, for the sake of their **growth in love of God and neighbor**."

(Catechism Glossary)

There are Five:

- You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor. (In the Diocese of Birmingham that includes all Sundays and January 1*, August 15*, November 1*, December 8**, and December 25) You shall confess your sins at least once
- You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season. (From Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday.)
- You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. (Required days of fast- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for those
 - ages 18-59. Required days of abstinence from meat- Those days, plus all the Fridays of Lent for those ages 14 or older.)
- You shall help provide for the needs of the Church.

*Except when that date falls on a Saturday or Monday.


