PLENARY INDULGENCE GRANTED FOR NATIVITY DEVOTION

The Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See is granting a special plenary indulgence in connection with the 800th anniversary of the Nativity Scene. In 1223 St. Francis of Assisi established the first nativity in the town of Greccio, Italy.

A plenary indulgence is the remission of temporal punishment due from sin that has already been forgiven. The temporal punishment includes damaged relationships, lasting injustices, wounds in our own heart, etc. If these are not addressed before death, they are addressed in the state of purgatory after death.


Between now and February 2nd (The Feast of the Presentation), a person may gain a plenary indulgence by visiting a church or chapel displaying a nativity scene. The person must: have a total detachment from all sin; go to sacramental confession within 20 days before or after the visit; receive Holy Communion within 20 days before or after the visit; pray one Hail Mary for the intentions of the Pope; pray one Our Father, a Creed (Nicene or Apostles'), and the following prayer,

"Dearest Jesus, Infant King, have mercy on us, Most Blessed Mother, Queen of Peace, have mercy on us, Good St. Joseph, Guardian and Protector of the Church, have mercy on us, St. Francis of Assisi, Protagonist of Peace, have mercy on us."

The ordinary way to remove the eternal punishment due from sin is Absolution in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Indulgences address only the **temporal punishment** that results from sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence, a person **must have a total detachment from all sin**. If a person **lacks a total detachment from all sin**, **they will receive a partial indulgence**.


