Father Bill's Weekly Message

MESSAGE OF POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2024

"Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom. Jesus himself, we recall each year on the first Sunday of Lent, was driven into the desert by the Spirit in order to be tempted in freedom. For forty days, he will stand before us and with us: the incarnate Son. God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters."

"It is a time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause. To pause in prayer, in order to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of the wounded brother or sister. Love of God and love of neighbor are one love. Not to have other gods is to pause in the presence of God beside the flesh of our neighbor. For this reason, prayer, almsgiving and fasting are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us."

"I invite every Christian community to offer its members moments set aside to rethink their lifestyles, times to examine their presence in society and the contribution they make to its betterment. Woe to us if our Christian penance were to resemble the kind of penance that so dismayed Jesus. To us too, he says, "Whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others they are fasting." Instead, let others see joyful faces, catch the scent of freedom and experience the love that makes all things new, beginning with the smallest and those nearest to us."

"To the extent that this Lent becomes a time of conversion, an anxious humanity will notice a burst of creativity, a flash of new hope. For faith and charity take hope, this small child by the hand. They teach her to walk, and at the same time, she leads them forward."

ST. JOHN DE BREBEUF RELIC ON TOUR

The skull of St. Jean de Brebeuf, Jesuit missionary and North American martyr, will be at the Cathedral of St. Paul in Birmingham on Friday, February 23rd as part of a monthlong relic tour. Veneration of the holy relic will be from 3:30-5:00 p.m. and 7:30-9:00 p.m., with a presentation on the life of the martyr at 7:00 p.m. Both the presentation and veneration are open to the public.

Lenten Regulations

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (February 14) until the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (March 28). "The faithful, listening more intensely to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises (at Easter)." (Ceremonial of Bishops, #249)

<u>Fasting:</u> Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast for those ages 18 through 59. Only one full meal is allowed, though a person may eat two smaller meals to maintain strength.

Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, plus all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those ages 14 and older.

<u>Confession:</u> It is recommended that all Catholics celebrate the sacrament of Penance during the Lent or Easter seasons (February 14-May 19).


