Father Bill's Weekly Message

THE REAL PRESENCE

If you have been reading the booklet, <u>20</u>

Answers on The Eucharist, there may be some questions you have about what exactly the Catholic Church means when it uses the term, "Real Presence." Good. That is the point of the Eucharistic Revival.

It is not my responsibility to explain what other Christians believe. If you want to know that, ask one of their ministers. My responsibility is to help you understand the teaching of the Catholic Church about the Real Presence of the Eucharist.

The author, Trent Horn, writes in the booklet, "The Catholic view of the Eucharist is different from the Protestant views because Catholics believe that the bread and wine at Mass actually become the physical body and blood of Christ. After consecration, the bread and wine no longer remain, and in their place is the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ." (p. 11)

It is important to remember that Catholics believe Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. He no longer has what St. Paul calls, "a natural body", but a "glorified, resurrected" body. (1 Corinthians 15, 36-49) The body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist are glorified, spiritual, resurrected. (ibid.)

The bread still tastes like bread. The wine still tastes like wine, and you can drink too much of it and get drunk! But the substance of each species is the Risen Lord Jesus Christ. It is no longer ordinary bread and ordinary wine. It is the resurrected body, blood, soul, and divinity of the Lord under the form of bread and the form of wine.

It is important to believe in the Real Presence because then you believe, "It is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1374) If you reject belief in the real presence, you reject that Christ is "wholly and entirely present" in the sacrament. It reveals what you believe about Jesus Christ.


