Father Bill's Weekly Message

ACKNOWLEDGING THE REAL PRESENCE

Because we believe that, after the consecration, the bread and wine are no longer ordinary bread and wine, we behave toward the consecrated eucharist as we would to the Risen Jesus Christ.


First, the tabernacle: We read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent, outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord under the Eucharistic species. It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament." (CCC #1379)

Genuflection: "A genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament. All who pass by the Most Blessed Sacrament (in the tabernacle) genuflect, unless they are moving in procession." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, #274)

If a person is unable to genuflect, they may make a profound bow (at the waist) as a sign of recognition of the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist in the tabernacle.

Also, a person genuflects or bows towards the tabernacle when entering and exiting a pew before and after Mass.

We observe these practices because we believe in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. These actions only make sense if we believe that the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.


