The meeting was opened with prayer by Jennifer. Jennifer called the meeting to order. Jennifer made a motion to approve the minutes from the April meeting, Bart seconded the motion. The minutes were then approved by a unanimous vote.

Committee Reports

Building Committee: Fundraising is underway for the Bell Tower and Church Sign. As of the date of this meeting, \$94,487.00 has been pledged/donated towards the \$100,000.00.

Regarding Betty and Yolie's house, plans are being made to turn the house into the new rectory. The inside is being painted. A new laminated floor is being installed in the master bedroom. A new roof is scheduled to be installed by the first of June. When these projects are complete, Father Bill will move in. Then the current rectory can be sold. The rest of the estate has yet to be disposed of.

The committee will meet again in the fall to start planning for construction.

Finance Committee: Father Bill gave the report. Total Income is greater than budget for both month and year. Operating Expenses are higher than budget for the month due to taxes and slightly higher than budget for the year. Net Cash Flow are greater than budget for both the month and year. Operating Cash Flow (less Restrictive) is greater than budget for both the month and for the year.

Knights of Columbus: The KOC will be selling BBQ during the Memorial Day Weekend. Set up and cooking will begin Thursday May 27th, sale will be Friday May 28th. The next Knights Mass is Sunday, May 30th at the 8:30 am mass. Next Council meeting is Monday, May 24th.

Maintenance Committee: There was a leak after the rains of April 5-9. Goodgame Construction came to inspect the roof. No information on what they did, but there were no leaks following the rain the first week of May.

Religious Education: RCIA will resume in the Fall. We have hired a new Director of Religious Education. It is Jim Mathis, who grew up in our parish and was a participant in Religious Education and Youth Group. Jim will be on the payroll beginning May 22nd. He is already doing orientation with Kelly, who is his aunt.

Liturgy Committee: Liturgy Committee met May 6th. They discussed the future of celebrating Mass after training for liturgical ministers will need to be scheduled. There will be two lectors at Mass when possible. The deacons will continue to recruit someone to be Minister of Holy Communion when needed for Mass. Bishop Raica is still prohibiting the chalice for communion for the laity. An announcement of the changes in the celebration of the Mass appeared in the bulletin this past week and will continue to appear there for two more weeks.

Latino Committee: They are meeting on the third Saturday of each month in the Parish Hall at 6:00 pm. Everyone is welcome.

Old Business

- Year of the Parish
 - Deacons and Father Bill continue to reach out to parishioners who have been away from parish activities.

New Business

- Changes for Mass: We can have two lectors for each Mass. We will continue to have three communion stations, at least during the Sunday morning Masses. Once some of the ropes are removed from the pews, we will no longer need to go to the parish hall to distribute communion. Ushers who have received a COVID-19 vaccine or who have recovered from COVID-19 are no longer required to wear a mask while taking up the collection. Also, the procession with the gifts and the collection can be restarted in June. The Mass will no longer be recorded or broadcast in the parish hall or online after May 23rd. We can return to having the ministry of altar servers in June.

Father closed the meeting with a prayer.
